Moms & Midterms

Women have voted at higher rates than men in every presidential and midterm election since 1984, per the Center for American Women and Politics. It's not surprising that women – especially mothers – were influential and heavily courted in 2018 and 2020 congressional races. Democrats anticipated that the June Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v Wade would be a big driver for suburban women, especially in key swing districts. But American moms aren't a single voting bloc, and priorities can vary drastically from district to district. From the economy to abortion, school safety to health care and housing, we look at the many topics that hit home and motivate moms.

Economy Looms Large for Voters

The conventional political wisdom is that Americans vote with their wallets, and most polls show the economy leading voter issues this fall. The economy is a broad and complex topic - and right now includes decades-high inflation, high gas prices and talk of an impending recession, along with a solid job market and student loan forgiveness. For some households, it's meant a new, more flexible job. For others, a struggle to cover post-COVID health care costs. For nearly every consumer, more money at grocery stores and gas pumps. How are household budget decisions influencing voters across the country - especially in races that could tip the balance of power in Washington?

Midterm Movers Outside the Fray

In states with Senate races that will influence the balance of power in Washington, airwaves are heavy, debates are fierce, and local news is full of day-to-day campaign activities. In other states, it may take a little more motivation to cast a ballot. When personalities and pointed politicking aren't part of the agenda, and hot Senate, House, and gubernatorial races are not on the ballot, which issues are pushing voters to get out to vote?

Immigration's Key Role in Midterm Push

With immigration front-and-center in some hotly contested U.S. Senate and governor's races, the topic has taken a top spot among voter issues nationwide. It's an issue far more complex than the political rhetoric and pushing a new wave of young activists to canvass and encourage voters to think about the issue from a more personal perspective, and to look at broader issues like education and equity.
